RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Unless otherwise specified, all hunter classes to be judged on performance and soundness.
2. Every animal entered for competition shall be under the control of show management; but the hosting competition & BHC Management will in no way be responsible for any loss, accident or damage that may occur by fire or otherwise and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor, spectator, trainer and attendant hold the competition & BHC Management, and its members, employees and agents harmless for any loss or damage that may occur to any persons, animals or property at the show.
3. Management reserves the right to cancel, combine or divide any classes if in its opinion the entries so warrant, while maintaining minimum USEF requirements to fill a class.
4. Course diagrams will be posted at least one hour prior to each class. Management reserves the right to restrict the area of the courtesy circle by a MANDATORY LINE. The same will be indicated on course diagrams and a corresponding barrier will be erected in the ring.
5. Each entry will be charged an office fee of \$15.00.
6. Jumpers times calculated at 360 yds/minute. For other than first place the time taken to complete the first round will decide between horses with equal faults. Jump orders will be established at the in gate.
7. Riders must be members of ASPCA, CHJA and NEHC to compete in those respective medal classes. No membership requirement for NEHC or CHSA Pleasure.
8. In order to compete for CHJA annual year-end awards, the owner of the horse or pony must be a member of the CHJA and the horse or pony must be registered with the CHJA.
9. Weekday recognized shows will have points awarded for CHJA & CHSA Medals only. Please note front cover for CHJA or CHSA recognition, or visit www.chja.net, or www.chsaonline.com for further information, class specifications and the CHJA & CHSA rule books.
10. NEHC classes will be "C" rated for Walk Trot Equitation & Pleasure, Children's Equitation, Modified Adult Equitation, Adult Equitation, Modified Adult Hunter, Children's Hunter, Adult Amateur Hunter, Pony Hunter, Junior Hunter, A/O Hunter, Pre-Green Hunter, Short Stirrup Eq/Hunter, Pre-Children's Hunter, Open Equitation, Hunter Pleasure, QH Hunter (Not Champ), Hunter Type Pet Pony, NEHC Pleasure. Please see the front cover for NEHC rating for each show. Please visit www.nehc.info for further information and rule book. NEHC class specifications may be read in the current NEHC rule book. Please note the time schedule for classes offered at each show.
11. Exhibitors must possess current memberships for all organizations and classes which require the same. Any fine levied against the horse show for invalid memberships will be the responsibility of the exhibitor.
12. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and /or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and /or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 7. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
13. Measurements by appointment with the on-call vet. Appointments must be made 48 hours prior to the show.
14. No USEF points awarded for M&S Hunter Classics.
15. Any returned checks will be charged an additional fee of \$100.
16. All dogs must be leashed and under control at all times. \$100 fine for loose dogs.
17. All class specifications & membership applications available at the secretary's desk.
18. No stabling available.
19. USEF "B" Rated division prize money: \$25 to first place in each class.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Please note that not all classes/divisions may be offered at every show.

LEADLINE

Open to riders who have not reached their 7th birthday and have not competed in any classes in a Recognized show other than leadline. Entries may be asked to trot. Riders to be judged on elementary fundamentals of horsemanship. An adult is required to lead each entry.

WALK TROT EQUITATION

Open to riders 10 years and under who have not competed in any class requiring them to canter or jump at a recognized show. Riders may not compete in any short stirrup classes. Riders will be asked to walk and trot in both directions of the ring. They will be judged on position and ability to control their mount. Diagonals will be considered.

SHORT STIRRUP EQUITATION

Open to riders 12 years and under who have never competed over fences exceeding 18" in an Recognized show. Riders showing in this division may not compete in any other recognized division or recognized class in a show with fences exceeding 18" with the exception of pleasure and pet-type pony classes.

PRE-CHILDREN'S EQUITATION

Open to junior riders who are eligible for Limit Equitation over fences as of December 1 of the current show year and have never shown over fences exceeding 2'6" at a recognized horse show. Riders may show horses or ponies. Fence height 2'0". At the same show, riders may not cross enter into Children's Equitation, Children's Pony Hunter, Pony Hunters, any Medal classes that exceed 2' or any class where fences exceed 2'6". No combinations permitted.

CHILDREN'S EQUITATION

Open to riders who are eligible for Children's Hunter, have not shown over a course where fences exceeded 3' at a Recognized show, and have never shown in the CHJA Junior Medal Finals. No combinations. Fences for horses and large ponies 2'6", for small/medium ponies 2'0".

ADULT EQUITATION

Open to Adult Amateurs. Courses must contain at least six individual jumping efforts, with one change of lead and at least one combination. Fences 2'9" - 3'

MODIFIED ADULT EQUITATION

Open to adult amateur riders who, as of Dec. 1 of the current show year, have not won six blue ribbons at any recognized shows in Adult Equitation classes, including CHJA Adult Medal classes, but excluding Modified Adult Classes. For amateurs who have won six blue ribbons, they are eligible for Modified Adult if, as of Dec. 1 of the current show year, they have not shown in classes with fences 3' or higher at more than three USEF or CHJA recognized horse shows within the past two show years. Fences not to exceed 2'6". Riders in this division cannot show in any other recognized classes at the same show where fences exceed 2'6". Judge may request USEF Tests 1-7.

JUNIOR EQUITATION

Open to all junior riders. Riders cannot cross enter into the Children's Equitation Division at the same show. Fence height 3'0".

OPEN EQUITATION

Open to all junior riders. Under 12—fences 2'3". 12-14—fences not to exceed 3'.

15-17—fences not to exceed 3'6"

FWPHA CHILDREN'S MEDAL

Open to junior riders. Testing or a flat phase of the top four riders, if available, is required. Fence height 2'6"

FWPHA MODIFIED ADULT MEDAL

Open to adult amateur riders. Testing or a flat phase of the top four riders, if available, is required. Fence height 2'6"

FWPHA MINI MEDAL

Open to junior riders. Testing or flat phase of the top four riders, if available, is required, or the test may be incorporated into the course. Fence height 3'

FWPHA ADULT MEDAL

Open to adult amateur riders. Testing or a flat phase of the top four riders, if available, is required, or the test may be incorporated into the course. Fence height 3'

FWPHA JUNIOR MEDAL

Open to junior riders. Test to be incorporated into the course. Fence height 3'6".

National PHA Medal/FWPHA 3'6" Medal

Open to junior riders. Fence height 3'6". See USEF Rule EQ 112.14

Pessoa/USEF Medal

Open to junior riders. Fences height 3'6". See USEF Rule EQ 112.9

ASPCA Maclay

Open to junior riders who are members of the ASPCA/National Horse Show. Fences 3'6". See USEF Rule EQ 112.12

USEF Talent Search

Open to junior riders. Fences 3'6" - 3'9". See USEF Rule EQ 112.13

USEF Pony Medal

Open to junior riders on ponies. See USEF Rule EQ 112.10

 Open to junior members of USEF or Equine Canada who have never competed in a National Equitation Final with fences at 3'6". To be shown over a minimum of eight fences 2'9" - 3' in height, spread not to exceed fence height. The course may be either a jumper or hunter type course and must include at least two changes of direction and a combination. Water obstacles are not permitted. The top four riders are required to perform at least two individual tests from SUEF Tests 1-19. An open numerical scoring system must be used in the first round, with each rider's score announced at the completion of their round. There is no minimum requirement to fill the class. Splitting of classes must be in accordance with USEF EQ103.3b

ARIAT NATIONAL ADULT MEDAL

Open to all amateur members of USEF and Equine Canada who are eligible to compete in the adult amateur hunter section at the show. A rider may not compete at the same show in any hunter or equitation class in which the jumps exceed 3'3". To be shown over a minimum of eight fences 2'9" - 3' in height, spread not to exceed fence height. The course may be either a jumper or hunter type course and must include at least two changes of direction and a combination. Water obstacles are not permitted. The top four riders are required to perform at least two individual tests from SUEF Tests 1-19. An open numerical scoring system must be used in the first round, with each rider's score announced at the completion of their round. There is no minimum requirement to fill the class. Splitting of classes must be in accordance with USEF EQ103.3b

WIHS PONY MEDAL

To be shown over a course of not less than six obstacles. Fence heights 2'3" for Smalls, 2'6" for Mediums, 3' for Larges. A maximum of 20 riders may be asked to return to show at the walk trot and canter and to perform any additional tests at the judges' discretion. Splitting of classes must be in accordance with USEF EQ103.3b

LOW TRAINING JUMPER DIVISION

Open to all horses and riders. Horse and rider combinations are not eligible to compete in any other jumper classes at the same show where heights exceed 3'6". Fence height not to exceed 3'0".

CONNECTICUT OPEN JUMPER DIVISION

Open to all horses and ponies. All obstacles shall be at least 3'6" in height, with a maximum height of 3'9" in the first round. Minimum spread 3'. Classes shall be scored using USEF tables.

CHILDREN'S/ADULT JUMPER

To be run in accordance with USEF/USHJA Zone specifications

CHJA CHILDREN'S MEDAL

Open to junior members of the CHJA who are eligible for Children's Hunter, have not shown over a course where fences exceeded 3' at a recognized show. If you have ever qualified or shown in a 3' equitation finals, you are ineligible for the Children's Medal. The class consists of 2 phases, The first phase is over a course of not less than eight obstacles at 2'6" in height, which must contain two changes of direction after the first fence with no combinations permitted. Judges will select at least eight contestants (if available) to show at a walk, trot and canter. The second flat phase is mandatory and will count 50%. The same horse to be shown by the same rider in both phases. To fill the class at least four competitors must complete both phases of the class. Judges may require additional testing, using current USEF Tests 1-8.

CHJA PONY MEDAL

Rider to be junior member of CHJA who has not reached his/her 18th birthday. The class consists of two phases. The first phase is shown over a course of not less than six obstacles. Small ponies to jump 2'. Medium ponies to jump 2'3". Large ponies to jump 2'9". Judges will select at least eight contestants (if available) to show at a walk, trot and canter. The second flat phase is mandatory and will count 50%. The same pony to be shown by the same rider in both phases. To fill the class at least four competitors must complete both phases of the class. Judges may require additional testing, using USEF tests 1-8.

CHJA JUNIOR MEDAL

Rider to be a junior member of CHJA. The class consists of two phases. The first phase is shown over a course of not less than eight obstacles 3' in height, which must include one combination including an oxer and two changes of direction after the first fence. Judges will select at least eight contestants (if available) to show at a walk, trot and canter. The second flat phase is mandatory and will count 50%. The same horse to be shown by the same rider in both phases. To fill the class at least four competitors must complete both phases of the class. Judges may require additional testing, using USEF tests 1-19.

CHJA ADULT MEDAL

Rider to be an adult amateur member of CHJA. The class consists of two phases. The first phase is shown over a course of not less than eight obstacles 3' in height, which must include one combination including an oxer and two changes of direction after the first fence. Judges will select at least eight contestants (if available) to show at a walk, trot and canter. The second flat phase is mandatory and will count 50%. The same horse to be shown by the same rider in both phases. To fill the class at least four competitors must complete both phases of the class. Judges may require additional testing, using USEF tests 1-19.

Federation Entry Agreement

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable-casts, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. MHC Medal Classes

No Medal Class finals in any seat will be held unless at least four riders have qualified. Finals will be held in September or October. To ride in a Medal class an exhibitor must be a member of MHC. If an exhibitor does not have a membership card with him/her, affidavits will be available at the show secretary's booth for \$25.00. If it is found that they are a member the \$25.00 will be refunded, if not, it will be applied to an individual membership for the current year.

JUNIOR HUNT SEAT MEDAL. Open to Junior members of the MHC who have not reached their 18th birthday. All contestants are required to perform over at least 8 fences not to exceed 3'. Ten points are required to qualify for the finals. After qualifying, a contestant is no longer eligible to enter this class. Failure to comply will result in disqualification from the Finals.

One or more individual tests of the top 4 contestants may be requested at the judge's discretion. (USEF tests 1-19). To fill a class, at least 4 competitors must complete the course.

ADULT/AMATEUR HUNT SEAT MEDAL. Open to adult members of MHC. All contestants are required to perform over at least eight fences 2'6" to 2'9", with at least one change of direction. One or more individual tests of the top four contestants may be requested at the judge's discretion. (USEF tests 1-17.) To fill a class at least four competitors must complete the course. After qualifying a contestant is no longer eligible to enter this class. Failure to comply will result in disqualification from the Finals.

HUNT SEAT MINI-MEDAL Open to members of MHC who have not reached their fifteenth birthday and have not competed in classes in which the entry is required to jump higher than three feet. All contestants are to compete over a course not exceeding eight fences and not less than six fences, excluding combination fences, at a height not to exceed 2'6". One or more individual test may be requested at the judge's discretion. (USEF current tests 1-8.) To fill a class at least four competitors must complete the course. After qualifying, contestant is no longer eligible to enter this class. Failure to comply will result in disqualifications from the Finals. A Mini Medal rider who competes in the Jr. Medal is no longer eligible to compete in the Mini Medal Division or Finals.

Qualifications for all medals. A contestant must accumulate 10 points to qualify for finals.

In order to maintain safety, any pony which bites, kicks or is uncontrollable will be excused from the ring.

APPOINTMENTS: Appropriate English or Western tack. No martingales or tie-downs.

MHJ CHILDREN'S MEDAL PONY

Open to all Junior riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1, 2008 and who have not shown over a course where the fences have exceeded 3'. To be shown over a minimum of 8 fences at the required height with at least two changes of direction after the first fence. A combination is optional and must be adjusted according to fence heights. The same pony must be used in all phases. Only one rider per pony. (riders may not ride in more than one height section of the class.) Fence heights Small/Medium 2' and Large 2'6". Competitors may not cross enter into the MHJ Mini-Medal. To fill a class, at least two competitors must complete the course. Ten points are required to qualify for the finals. Once qualified, riders may continue to show in the class until August 1, 2009. After August 1, 2009 only those riders not qualified may compete in the class.

MHJ CHILDREN'S MEDAL HORSE

Open to all Junior riders who have not reached their 19th birthday as of December 1, 2008 and who have not shown over a course

where the fences have exceeded 3'. Fence heights to be set at 2'6". To be shown over a minimum of 8 fences the required height including a combination and at least two changes of direction after the first fence. The same horse must be used in all phases. Only one rider per horse. Competitors may cross enter into the MHJ Mini-Medal or NEHJ Junior Talent Medal at the finals. To fill a class, at least two competitors must complete the course. Ten points are required to qualify for the finals. Once qualified, riders may continue to show in the class until August 1, 2009. After August 1, 2009 only those riders not qualified may compete in the class.

MHJ JUNIOR MEDAL

MHJ ADULT MINI-MEDAL

Open to all Adult Amateur competitors that have not shown over a course where the fences exceeded 3' in the current year. To perform over a course of at least 6 fences not to exceed 2'6". Competitors may not cross enter into the MHJ Adult Medal or the NEHJ Adult Talent Medal. To fill a class, at least two competitors must complete the course. Ten points are required to qualify for the finals. Once qualified, riders may continue to show in the class until August 1, 2009. After August 1, 2009 only those riders not qualified may compete in the class. Riders may cross enter into the MHJ Adult Medal.

NEHJ JUNIOR TALENT MEDAL

Open to Junior riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1, 2008. Riders shall perform over at least 8 fences not to exceed 3'. Time allowed will be figured at 360 yards per minute and calculated manually or electronically. At the judges discretion riders may be required to compete in a flat phase. Finals will include flatwork, gymnastics & jumping, including optional liverpools and the course may be held in the NEW Grass Derby Field on the sand ring. To fill a class, at least two competitors must complete the course. Ten points are required to qualify for the finals. Once qualified, riders may continue to show in the class until August 1, 2009. After August 1, 2009 only those riders not qualified may compete in the class. Riders may cross enter into the MHJ Junior Medal.

NEHJ CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE CLASSIC

Open to Junior riders who are eligible for Intermediate Equitation as of December 1 of the current show year. Height of fences 3'; spreads not to exceed fence height. Children's Hunter riders may not show in any class where the fence heights exceed 3'6" at the same show. Jogging for soundness at the discretion of the judge. To fill a class, at least two competitors must complete the course. Ten points are required to qualify for the finals. Ten points are required to qualify for the finals. Once qualified, riders may continue to show in the class until August 1, 2009. After August 1, 2009 only those riders not qualified may compete in the class. The course may be set at the New grass Derby Field or the Sand Ring at the finals.

NEHJ CHILDREN'S HUNTER PONY CLASSIC

Open to Junior riders who are eligible for Intermediate Equitation as of December 1 of the current show year. Height of fences for small/medium ponies 2' and large ponies 2'6'; spreads not to exceed fence height. Same horse/rider combination cannot show in any other rated division except Equitation. Children's Hunter riders may not show in any class where the fence heights exceed 3'6" at the same show. Jogging for soundness at the discretion of the judge. To fill a class, at least two competitors must complete the course. Ten points are required to qualify for the finals. Once qualified, riders may continue to show in the class until August 1, 2009. After August 1, 2009 only those riders not qualified may compete in the class. The course may be set at the New grass Derby Field or the Sand Ring at the finals.

NEHJ ADULT HUNTER CLASSIC

To be ridden by amateurs who are no longer eligible to compete as Junior exhibitors. To be judged on performance, soundness, manners, way of going, size of rider to mount, and suitability as an Adult Amateur Hunter. Horses and ponies may be jogged for soundness at Judge's discretion. Height of fences 3'; spreads not to exceed height of fence. Ponies may be ridden by adults suitability to count. To fill a class, at least two competitors must complete the course. Ten points are required to qualify for the finals. Once qualified, riders may continue to show in the class until August 1, 2009. After August 1, 2009 only those riders not qualified may compete in the class. The course may be set at the New grass Derby.
