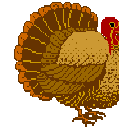

US Equestrian Federation Entry Agreement

By entering a US Equestrian recognized Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Vault, Longeur or Handler and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Constitution and Rules of the US Equestrian Federation and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Constitution and Rules of the US Equestrian and of this competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the US Equestrian, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the US Equestrian and/or this competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during this course of competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport or the US Equestrian. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of US Equestrian rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, any action instituted against the USA Equestrian must be filed in New York State. See Art. 1502.5.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF (CHJA, NEHC or CHSA) RULE BOOK. AND WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

1. Every class offered herein which is recognized by the CHJA will be conducted and judged in accordance with the current CHJA rules. To show in CHJA Medal Classes, riders must be members. In order to compete for CHJA Annual Year End Awards, the owner of the horse/pony must be a member of CHJA and the horse/pony must be registered with CHJA. A copy of the CHJA Rule Book, Medal Class specifications and membership applications are available at the Show Secretary's office and at www.chja.net.
2. In order to compete for CHSA Annual Horse Awards, the person registering the horse must be an individual Member or Honorary Member and the horse must be registered with CHSA. Points shall accrue upon receipt of application and dues by the Show secretary at a member show, or the postmark date of an application and dues sent to the membership chair person.
3. Prize money will be awarded at the Secretary's office following the completion of the division. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to collect prize monies.
4. Show Management reserves the right to change or vary the courses at their discretion.
5. Warm-Up Classes will be held at the discretion of Show Management, time permitting, at a fee specified in the class descriptions. Schooling before the start of show will be from 7:00-7:45 AM.
6. Show Management reserves the right to cancel, combine or divide classes if warranted.
7. All entry blanks must be signed by the owner, trainer, rider, or parent/guardian (when applicable) prior to numbers being assigned.
8. Scratches will be accepted with veterinarians' certificate. Other scratches will be allowed at Show Management discretion. No refunds will be given.
9. During judging no one other than the rider is allowed in the ring unless on official business.
10. Proper attire required for all exhibitors.
11. Exhibitors are notified that any discourteous behavior or disobedience by any owner, groom, or rider shall disqualify horse and entry fees will be forfeited.
12. A processing fee for all returned checks of \$50.00 will be charged.
13. No dogs allowed.
14. Every animal entered for competition shall be under control of the Show Management. Westbrook Hunt Club will in no way be responsible for any damage that may occur and it shall be a condition of every entry that each exhibitor shall hold Windcrest Farm as well as Show Management harmless for any loss or accident which may occur. Should any questions or disputes arise, it shall be referred Show Management whose decision is final.
15. All exhibitors must show current certification cards before numbers are issued.
16. Martingales prohibited in all flat or under saddle classes.
17. Hard Hats must be worn by anyone mounted on the premises.
18. Entry fees Regular Classes \$25.00; Walk Trot classes \$20; Medal Classes \$35.00 unless otherwise stated; Warm Up \$15
19. Trophy and Eight ribbons awarded in all classes unless otherwise stated.
20. Post Entry fee \$20.00 per horse.
21. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parents, guardians and or trainers who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent, guardians and/or trainers from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule."
22. If necessary, Show Management reserves the right to limit entries in classes due to time constraints. Entries will be allowed in such cases on a first come first serve basis. Show Management reserves the right to adjust the time schedule if necessary.
23. All classes in rated hunter divisions shall be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise noted.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

All classes are run According to USEF Zone 1 Specifications and where applicable are run according to the rules and specifications of the CHJA, CHSA and NEHC

WARM UP (\$15.00 (5 Horses/5 min.)

PLEASURE CLASSES (CHSA/NEHC 'C')

Entry Fee for Pleasure Classes is \$25. Walk Trot Pleasure classes are \$20.

All Pleasure classes will be run in the indoor ring during Warm-Up 'B'

HUNTER PLEASURE (NEHC/CHSA 'C')

Open to all horses of a hunter type ordinarily used for pleasure purposes, with no limitations as to status of rider. Walk, Trot, Canter both ways. Light contact required. Judged on manners, performance, quality, presence substance and soundness.

HUNTER PLEASURE CHAMPIONSHIP (NEHC/CHSA 'C')

Must have entered class Hunter Pleasure to participate.

ADULT ENGLISH PLEASURE (NEHC/CHSA 'C')

To be shown at Walk, Trot, Canter. Entries may be asked to back and Halt. To be judged on manners performance and suitability. Martingales prohibited. To be ridden on a reasonably loose rein on command.

ADULT ENGLISH PLEASURE CHAMPIONSHIP (NEHC/CHSA 'C')

Must have entered Adult English Pleasure Class to participate.

JUNIOR EXHIBITOR PLEASURE HORSE/PONY(NEHC/CHSA 'C')

To be shown at Walk, Trot, Canter. Entries may be asked to back and Halt. To be judged on manners performance and suitability. Martingales prohibited. To be ridden on a reasonably loose rein on command.

JUNIOR EXHIBITOR ENGLISH PLEASURE HORSE/PONY CHAMPIONSHIP. (NEHC/CHSA 'C') Must have entered Junion Exhibitor Pleasure class to participate

CHSA ENGLISH PLEASURE

Open To CHSA Members and Non-Members. Open to horses and ponies, Juniors and Adults. To Walk, Trot, Canter. May be asked to back. Extended gaits may be requested. To be ridden on a reasonably loose rein on command. To be judged on manners, performance, and suitability.

NEHC OPEN ENGLISH PLEASURE (NEHC/CHSA 'C')

Open to members and Non-members. Open to all horses ordinarily used for pleasure purposes with no limitations as to the status of rider or place of residence. To be shown at walk, trot or jog, canter or lope. Loose rein on command of judge only, but without loss of contact. Will be required to back. Shall be judged on manners, performance and quality, in that order. All horses shall be judged on their respective merits regardless of type.

PONY PLEASURE (NEHC 'C', CHSA)

Open to ponies only. To be judged Walk, Trot, Canter both ways of the ring. Open to Juniors of any age. Judged on manners, suitability and performance.

PONY PLEASURE CHAMPIONSHIP (NEHC 'C')

Must have entered Pony Pleasure to participate

QUARTER HORSE HUNTER U/S (NEHC 'C', CHSA)

Must be registered w/AQHA. Papers upon request.

QUARTER HORSE HUNTER U/S CHAMPIONSHIP (NEHC Non-rated)Must have entered Quarter Horse Hunter U/S to participate

MEDAL CLASSES

\$35.00 Entry Fee for Medal Classes

CHSA SHORT STIRRUP EQUITATION MEDAL: Open to riders 12 years and under as of December 1, 2008; at least one rider must be a current member of CHSA and all riders must be eligible for Short Stirrup Equitation. At least three entrants must complete the course in order for the class to count. Fence height 18".

CHSA PRE-CHILDREN'S EQUITATION MEDAL: Open to Junior Riders who have not reached his/her 18th birthday; at least one rider must be a current member of CHSA and all riders must be eligible for Pre-Children's Equitation At least three entrants must complete the course in order for the class to count. Fence height 2'.

CHSA CHILDREN'S EQUITATION MEDAL: Open to Junior Riders who have not reached his/her 18th birthday; at least one rider must be a current member of CHSA and all riders must be eligible for Children's Equitation. At least three entrants must complete the course in order for the class to count. Fence height 2'6".

CHSA MODIFIED ADULT EQUITATION MEDAL

Open to Amateur Adult Members; at least one rider must be a current member of CHSA and all riders must be eligible for Modified Adult Equitation and have not shown over a course with fences 3' or higher at more than three recognized horse shows within the past two show years. Fence height 2'6"

CHJA CHILDREN'S MEDAL Open to Junior members of the CHJA who are eligible for Children's Hunter, have not shown over a course where fences exceeded 3' at a Recognized show. If you have ever qualified or shown in a 3' Equitation Finals including CHJA, you are not eligible for the Children's Medal. The class consists of two phases. The first phase is over a course of not less than eight obstacles at 2'6" in height, which must contain two changes of direction after the first fence with no combinations permitted. Judges will select at least six contestants (if available) to show at a walk, trot, and canter. The second (flat) phase is mandatory and will count 50%. The same horse to be shown by the same rider in both phases. To fill the class at least four competitors must complete both phases of the class. Judges may require additional testing, using current USEF Tests 1-

CHJA PONY MEDAL Rider to be a Junior Member of CHJA who has not reached his/her 18th birthday. The class consists of two phases. The first phase is shown over a course of not less than six obstacles. Small ponies to jump obstacles 2'0" in height, Medium ponies to jump obstacles 2'3" in height, and Large ponies to jump obstacles 2'9" in height. If a combination is used, suggested distances for in and outs are 20' for small, 22' for medium, and 24' for large ponies. If the distance between obstacles is less than 72' then the distance must be adjusted for each height section. Judges will select at least six contestants (if available) to show at a walk, trot, and canter. The second (flat) phase is mandatory and will count 50%. The same pony to be shown by the same rider in both phases. To fill the class at least four competitors must complete both phases of the class. Judges may require additional testing, using current USEF Tests 1-8.

T.H.I.S. NATIONAL CHILDREN'S MEDAL (Capital Challenge)

Open to all Junior members of the USEF and CEF who have never competed in a National Equitation Final with fences at 3'6" (i.e.; Pessoa/USEF Medal; ASPCA Maclay; USET; CET or CEF Finals; WIHS Capital Cup). To be shown over a minimum of eight fences 2'9" to 3' in height, spread not to exceed fence height. The course may be either a Jumper or Hunter type course and must include at least two changes of direction and a combination. Water obstacles (i.e.; water jump, liverpool) are not permitted. The top four riders are required to perform at least two individual tests from USEF Tests 1-19. An Open Numerical Scoring System must be used in the first round, with each rider's score announced at the completion of their round. There is no minimum requirement to fill the class.

HUNT SEAT EQUITATION CLASSES (CHJA/CHSA/NEHC/USEF)

Entry fee for Hunt Seat Equitation classes is \$25.00. A trophy and eight ribbons will be awarded in each class.

PRE CHILDREN'S EQUITATION DIVISION (CHJA, CHSA)

Open to junior riders who are eligible for Limit Equitation over fences as of December 1 of the current show year and have never shown over fences exceeding 2'6" at a recognized horse show. Riders may show horses or ponies. Fence height 2'0". At the same show, riders may not cross enter into Children's Equitation, Children's Pony Hunter, Pony Hunters, any Medal classes that exceed 2' or any class where fences exceed 2'6". No combinations permitted.

CHILDREN'S EQUITATION DIVISION (CHJA, CHSA, MHJ, NEHC 'C')

Open to riders who are eligible for Children's Hunter, have not shown over a course where fences exceeded 3' at a Recognized show, and have never shown in the CHJA Junior Medal Finals. No combinations. Fences for horses and large ponies 2'6", for small/medium ponies 2'0".

JUNIOR EQUITATION DIVISION (CHJA, CHSA, MHJ)

Open to all junior riders. Riders cannot cross enter into the Children's Equitation Division at the same show. Fence height 3'0".

MODIFIED ADULT EQUITATION DIVISION (CHJA, CHSA, MHJ, NEHC 'C')

Open to Amateur Adult riders who have not won six blue ribbons in recognized adult equitation classes or CHJA Adult Medal Classes, excluding Modified Adult Equitation. For amateurs who have won six blue ribbons, they are eligible for Modified Adult if, as of Dec. 1 of the current show year, they have not shown in classes with fences 3' or higher at more than three USEF or CHJA recognized horse shows within the past two show years. Riders may not show in any other class where fences exceed 2'6" at the same show. Judge may request test 1-7. Fences not to exceed 2'6".

AMATEUR ADULT EQUITATION DIVISION (CHJA/CHSA/NEHC 'C', MHJ)

Open to Adult Amateurs. Courses must contain at least six individual jumping efforts, with one change of lead and at least one combination.

Adult Equitation Fences 2'9" to 3"

CHJA ADULT MEDAL: Rider to be an Amateur Adult Member of the CHJA. The class consists of two phases. The first phase is shown over a course of not less than eight obstacles 3' in height, which must include one combination including an oxer, and two changes of direction (change of lead) after the first fence. Judges will select at least six contestants (if available) to show at a walk, trot, and canter. The second (flat) phase is mandatory and will count 50%. The same horse to be shown by the same rider in both phases. To fill the class at least four competitors must complete both phases of the class. Judges may require additional testing, using current USEF Tests 1-19.

NEHC ADULT MEDAL

Open to Adult Amateur Members of the NEHC. All contestants are required to perform over at least eight fences not exceeding 3'. One or more individual tests of the top four contestants may be requested at the judge's discretion (USEF Tests 1-19) To fill a class, at least four competitors must complete the course. One win required for the finals. All contestants must wear proper attire. Once a contestant has qualified, they are no longer eligible for Medal classes. Violation will forfeit eligibility for the finals for that year.

ARIAT ADULT MEDAL

To be shown over at least eight fences not to exceed 3'. At least two changes of direction, a combination, no water. Open numerical scoring in 1st round. Top 4 or 20% of riders from 1st round will be required to perform at least two individual tests from USEF current tests 1-19.

M&S ADULT MEDAL

Open to Adult and Amateur Riders. To be shown over a minimum of 8 fences at 3' including a combination and at least two changes of direction after the first fence. Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same horse must be used in all phases. Only one rider per horse. To fill the class, three riders must complete the course. The rider must be a member in order for points to count toward qualifying for the Finals.

FWPHA MODIFIED ADULT MEDAL

Open to to adult amateur riders. Testing or a flat phase of the top four riders, if available, or mngmt may opt to incorporate the test into the course. Class may be run in conjunction with another recognized class with the same specs. Fence height 2'6".

FWPHA CHILDREN'S MEDAL

Open to all juniot riders. Testing or a flat phase of the top four riders if available is required, or mgmt may incorporate a test into the course. Class may be run in conjunction with another recognized class with the same specs. Fence height 2'6".

FWPHA MEDAL

Open to junior riders. Fence height 3'6". Medal may be run in conjunction with another recognized class with the same specs, or may incorporate the test into the course.

PHA MEDAL

The National PHA Medal Hunter Seat Equitation Class is open to riders under 18 years of age. To be shown over a course of eight or more fences at 3'6" in height, with at least one combination including an oxer and two changes of lead after the first fence. The judge will insert two tests into the original course (USEF Tests 1-18). Further testing of the top riders is optional. Only one rider per horse. To fill a class, six competitors must complete the course.

HUNT SEAT LEAD LINE- Open to riders who have not reached their 7th birthday and have not competed in any classes in any recognized show other than leadline. Entries may be asked to trot. Riders to be judged on elementary fundamentals of horsemanship. An adult is required to lead each entry.

WALK-TROT DIVISION (CHSA/CHJA/NEHC 'C')

Open to riders 10 years and younger and who have not competed in classes requiring them to canter or Jump at a recognized show.. Riders may not show in short stirrup.

SHORT STIRRUP EQUITATION DIVISION (CHJA/CHSA/NEHC 'C', MHJ)

Open to riders 12 years and under who have never competed over fences exceeding 18" in a recognized show. Riders showing in this division may not compete in any other recognized division or recognized class in a show with fences exceeding 18" with the exception of pleasure and pet-type pony classes.

Short Stirrup Cross Rails Equitation 18" (MHJ Short Stirrup Medal Qualifier)

CHJA JUNIOR MEDAL

Rider to be a Junior Member of CHJA who has not reached his/her 18th birthday. The class consists of two phases. The first phase is shown over a course of not less than eight obstacles 3' in height, which must include one combination including an oxer, and two changes of direction (change of lead after the first fence. Judges will select at least six contestants (if available) to show at a walk, trot, and canter. The second (flat) phase is mandatory and will count 50%. The same horse to be shown by the same rider in both phases. To fill the class at least four competitors must complete both phases of the class. Judges may require additional testing, using current USEF Tests 1-19.

MARSHALL & STERLING CHILDREN'S MEDAL PONY

Open to Junior Riders on ponies who are not competing at the same show in any hunter or equitation class in which the fences exceed 3'3". To be shown over a minimum of 8 fences the required height with at least two changes of direction after the first fence. A combination is optional, and must be adjusted according to fence heights. Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same pony must be used in all phases. Only one rider per pony. (Riders may not ride in more than one height section of the class.) Three riders must complete the course in order for points to count. The rider must be a member in order for points to count toward qualifying for the Finals. No cross entry of rider into the M&S Children's Horse Medal at the same show. Fence Height 2'for Sm/Med, 2'6"for Lg).

MARSHALL & STERLING CHILDREN'S MEDAL HORSE

Open to Junior Riders on horses who are not competing at the same show in any hunter or equitation class in which the fences exceed 3'3". To be shown over a minimum of 8 fences the required height including a combination and at least two changes of direction after the first fence. Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same horse must be used in all phases. Only one rider per horse. Three riders must complete the course in order for points to count. The rider must be a member in order for points to count toward qualifying for the Finals. No cross entry of rider into the M&S Children's Pony Medal at the same show. Fence height 3'

ASPCA MACLAY

For junior riders who are junior patrons of the ASPCA and must show their
 ASPCA numbers on the entry blank. To fill the class at least 6 competitors must complete the course.

PLATINUM PERFORMANCE/USEF TALENT SEARCH

USEF Show Jumping Talent Search Class. A test of the abilities of an individual as a show jumping
 rider, is open to Junior/Young Riders who are members of the United States Equestrian Federation
 who have not reached their 21st birthday under USEF rules. Fences 3'6"-3'9".

NEHC JUNIOR MEDAL

Open to Junior Members of the NEHC who have not reached their eighteenth birthday. All
 contestants are required to perform over at least eight fences not exceeding 3'3". One or more
 individual tests of the top four contestants may be requested at the judge's discretion (USEF Tests1-
 18). To fill a class, at least four competitors must complete the course. One win required for the
 finals. All contestants must wear proper attire. Once a contestant has qualified, they are no longer
 eligible for Medal classes. Violation will forfeit eligibility for the finals for that year.

CENTRAL EQUINE JUNIOR MEDAL (M&S) Open to Junior Riders. To be shown over a
 minimum of 8 fences at 3'6" including a combination and at least two changes of direction after the
 first fence. Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same horse must be used
 in all phases. Only one rider per horse. To fill the class, three riders must complete the course.

HUNTER DIVISIONS

 Division or Recognized Class in a show where obstacles exceed 18" in height. Course not to exceed
 eight fences, not to exceed 18".
