Federation Entry Agreement Effective 12/1/09

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the Competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the Competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable-casts, **broadcasts, internet, film, new media** or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the Competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the Competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

USEF Membership Statement

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory are classes level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF (CHJA, NEHC or CHSA) RULE BOOK. AND WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

1. Every class offered herein which is recognized by the CHJA will be conducted and judged in accordance with the current CHJA rules. To show in CHJA Medal Classes, riders must be members. In order to compete for CHJA Annual Year End Awards, the owner of the horse/pony must be a member of CHJA and the horse/pony must be registered with CHJA. A copy of the CHJA Rule Book, Medal Class specifications and membership applications are available at the Show Secretary's office and at www.chja.net.
2. In order to compete for CHSA Annual Horse Awards, the person registering the horse must be an individual Member or Honorary Member and the horse must be registered with CHSA. Points shall accrue upon receipt of application and dues by the Show secretary at a member show, or the postmark date of an application and dues sent to the membership chair person.
3. Prize money will be awarded at the Secretary's office following the completion of the division. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to collect prize monies.
4. Show Management reserves the right to change or vary the courses at their discretion.
5. Warm-Up Classes will be held at the discretion of Show Management, time permitting, at a fee specified. Schooling before the start of show will be from 7:00-7:45 AM.
6. Show Management reserves the right to cancel, combine or divide classes if warranted.
7. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorize vehicle of any kind, including but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims or losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility-assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
8. All entry blanks must be signed by the owner, trainer, rider, and/or parent/guardian (when applicable) prior to numbers being assigned.
9. Scratches will be accepted with veterinarians' certificate; other scratches will be allowed/disallowed at Show Management's discretion. No refunds will be given.
10. During judging, unless on official business, no one other than the rider is allowed in the ring.
11. Proper attire required for all exhibitors.
12. Exhibitors are notified that any discourteous behavior or disobedience by any owner, groom, or rider shall disqualify horse and entry fees will be forfeited.
13. A processing fee of \$50 will be charged for all returned checks.
14. All dogs must be leashed at all times.
15. Every animal entered for competition shall be under control of the Show Management. Westbrook Hunt Club will in no way be responsible for any damage that may occur and it shall be a condition of every entry that each exhibitor shall hold WHC as well as Show Management harmless for any loss or accident which may occur. Should any questions or disputes arise, it shall be referred Show Management whose decision is final.
16. All exhibitors must show current certification cards before numbers are issued.
17. Martingales prohibited in all flat or under saddle classes.
18. ASTM-certified helmets must be worn by anyone mounted on the premises.
19. Entry fees: Regular Classes \$25.; Lead Line and Walk Trot classes \$20; Medal Classes \$40. unless otherwise stated; Warm Up \$20.
20. Trophy and eight ribbons awarded in all classes unless otherwise stated.
21. Entries close at 5pm the night before; after that time they are subject to post entry fee of \$20.

- 22. If necessary, Show Management reserves the right to limit entries in classes due to time constraints. Entries will be allowed in such cases on a first come first serve basis. Show Management reserves the right to adjust the time schedule if necessary.
- 23. All classes in rated hunter divisions shall be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise noted.
- 24. Show Management may fine individuals up to \$100 for improper needles/sharps disposals.
- 25. Temporary stalls with doors are available for a day rate of \$35.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

All classes are run According to USEF Zone 1 Specifications, and where applicable are run according to the rules and specifications of the CHJA, CHSA, NEHC, M&S.

100. BLUE/RED Warm-Up Hunter (\$20.00 per Round) **Open all day; horses/riders may do as many trips as they like;** Blue ribbon to horses/ponies with score of 76+; Red ribbon to horses/ponies with score of 70-75.

PLEASURE CLASSES (CHSA/NEHC 'C')

Entry Fee for Walk-Trot Pleasure is \$20 and Pleasure CHSA/NEHC is \$25.

WALK-TROT PLEASURE (CHSA/NEHC 'C') Open to riders 10 years and younger and who have not competed in classes requiring them to canter or jump.

1. & 2. Walk-Trot Pleasure

3. CHSA ENGLISH PLEASURE Open to members and non-members

4. NEHC OPEN ENGLISH PLEASURE Open to members and Non-members.

HUNTER SEAT EQUITATION (CHJA/CHSA/NEHC)

Entry fee is \$25.00 unless otherwise indicated. Walk Trot Equitation is \$20.

SHORT STIRRUP EQUITATION (CHJA/CHSA/NEHC 'C')

Open to riders 12 years and under who have never competed over fences exceeding 18" in a recognized show. Riders showing in this division may not compete in any other recognized division or recognized class in a show with fences exceeding 18" except pleasure and pet-type pony classes.

5. Short Stirrup Equitation WTC

6. & 7. Short Stirrup Equitation 18" (verticals or X-rails)

8. HUNT SEAT LEAD LINE

Open to riders who have not reached their 7th birthday as of 12/1/10, and have never shown in other than lead line at any recognized show. Riders will be asked to trot. An adult is required to lead each entry.

WALK-TROT EQUITATION (CHSA/CHJA/NEHC 'C')

Open to riders 10 years and younger and who have not competed in classes requiring them to canter or Jump at a recognized show.

9. & 10. Walk-Trot Equitation

PRE CHILDREN'S EQUITATION (CHJA, CHSA)

Open to junior riders who are eligible for Limit Equitation over fences as of December 1 of the current show year and have never shown over fences exceeding 2'6" at a recognized horse show. Riders may show horses or ponies. Fence height 2'0". At the same show, riders may not cross enter into Children's Equitation, Children's Pony Hunter, Pony Hunters, any Medal classes that exceed 2' or any class where fences exceed 2'6".

11. Pre Children's Equitation Flat

12. & 13. Pre Children's Equitation Fences 2'

CHILDREN'S EQUITATION (CHJA, CHSA, NEHC 'C')

Open to riders who are eligible for Children's Hunter, have not shown over a course where fences exceeded 3' at a Recognized show, and have never shown in the CHJA Junior Medal Finals. Horses and large ponies 2'6"; small/medium ponies 2'0".

14. Children's Equitation Flat

15. & 16.. Children's Equitation Fences

JUNIOR EQUITATION (CHJA, CHSA)

Open to all junior riders. Riders cannot cross enter into the Children's Equitation Division at the same show. Fence height 3'0".

17. Junior Equitation Flat

18. & 19. Junior Equitation Fences 3'

OPEN EQUITATION (CHJA, CHSA, NEHC 'C')

20. Open Equitation Under 12 Flat

21. Open Equitation Under 12 Fences 2'3"

22. Open Equitation 12-14 Flat

23. Open Equitation 12-14 Fences-not to exceed 3'

24. Open Equitation 15-17 Flat

25. Open Equitation 15-17 Fences-not to exceed 3' 6"

MODIFIED ADULT EQUITATION (CHJA, CHSA, NEHC 'C')

Open to Amateur Adult riders who have not won six blue ribbons in recognized adult equitation classes or CHJA Adult Medal Classes, excluding Modified Adult Equitation. For amateurs who have won six blue ribbons, they are eligible for Modified Adult if, as of Dec. 1 of the current show year, they have not shown in classes with fences 3' or higher at more than three USEF or CHJA recognized horse shows within the past two show years. Riders may not show in any other class where fences exceed 2'6" at the same show. Fences not to exceed 2'6".

26. Modified Adult Equitation Flat

27. & 28. Modified Adult Equitation Fences

AMATEUR ADULT EQUITATION (CHJA/CHSA/NEHC 'C')

29. Adult Equitation Flat

30. & 31. Adult Equitation Fences 2'9" to 3"

MEDAL CLASSES: \$40.00 Entry Fee unless otherwise indicated.

CHSA MEDALS: Open to members and nonmembers, but only members accrue points. At least 3 riders must complete the class; at least one must be a CHSA member. Two tests (USEF 1-8) will be included in each course. Riders may compete in only one CHSA Medal class per show.

CHJA MEDALS: Open to members only. At least 4 riders must complete the both the flat and fence phase. The flat phase to count 50%. The same horse/pony and rider in both phases. Members may compete in only one CHJA Medal class per show.

32. CHSA SHORT STIRRUP EQUITATION MEDAL: Open to riders 12 years and under as of December 1 of the current show year. Fence height 18".

33. CHSA PRE-CHILDREN'S EQUITATION MEDAL: Fences 2'.

34. CHSA CHILDREN'S EQUITATION MEDAL: Fences 2'6".

35. CHSA MODIFIED ADULT EQUITATION MEDAL: Fence height 2'6".

36. CHJA JUNIOR MEDAL: Fences at 3'; optional current USEF Tests 1-19.

37. MARSHALL & STERLING CHILDREN'S MEDAL PONY Open to Junior Riders on ponies who are not competing at the same show in any hunter or equitation class in which the fences exceed 3'3". Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same pony must be used in all phases. Only one rider per pony. (Riders may not ride in more than one height section of the class.) Three riders must complete the course in order for points to count. The rider must be a member in order for points to count toward qualifying for the Finals. No cross entry of rider into the M&S Children's Horse Medal at the same show. Fence Height 2'for Sm/Med, 2'6"for Lg).

38. MARSHALL & STERLING CHILDREN'S MEDAL HORSE Open to Junior Riders on horses who are not competing at the same show in any hunter or equitation class in which the fences exceed 3'3". Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same horse must be used in all phases. Only one rider per horse. Three riders must complete the course in order for points to count. The rider must be a member in order for points to count toward qualifying for the Finals. No cross entry of rider into the M&S Children's Pony Medal at the same show. Fence height 3'.

39. PESSOA/USEF NATIONAL HUNT SEAT MEDAL Open to Junior Active Members of the USEF who have not yet reached their 18th birthday. Application for membership can be made direct to the Federation office or the exhibitor can join prior to the class through the secretary. Two or more tests of at least the top four competitors are required. Tests 1-19.

40. CHJA CHILDREN'S MEDAL: Juniors eligible for Children's Hunter and haven't jumped over 3' at recognized shows and never qualified or shown in a 3' equitation Final, including CHJA. Fences at 2'6".

41. CHJA PONY MEDAL: Fences at 2', 2'3", 2'6".

42. T.H.I.S. NATIONAL CHILDREN'S MEDAL Open to all Junior members of the USEF and CEF who have never competed in a National Equitation Final with fences at 3'6" (i.e.; Pessoa/USEF Medal; ASPCA Maclay; USET; CET or CEF Finals; WIHS Capital Cup). The top four riders are required to perform at least two individual tests from USEF Tests 1-19. An Open Numerical Scoring System must be used in the first round, with each rider's score announced at the completion of their round. There is no minimum requirement to fill the class.

43. CHJA ADULT MEDAL Fences at 3'.

44. NEHC ADULT MEDAL Open to Adult Amateur Members of the NEHC. One or more individual tests of the top four contestants may be requested at the judge's discretion (USEF Tests 1-19) To fill a class, at least four competitors must complete the course. One win required for the finals. All contestants must wear proper attire. Once a contestant has qualified, they are no longer eligible for Medal classes. Violation will forfeit eligibility for the finals for that year.

45. ARIAT ADULT MEDAL Open to Adult Amateurs. Fences not to exceed 3'. Open numerical scoring in 1st round. Top 4 or 20% of riders from 1st round will be required to perform at least two individual tests from USEF current tests 1-19.

46. FARNUM ADULT MEDAL (M&S) Open to Adult Amateurs. Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same horse must be used in all phases. Only one rider per horse. To fill the class, three riders must complete the course. The rider must be a member in order for points to count toward qualifying for the Finals.

48. ASPCA MACLAY Open to Junior Members of the ASPCA who have not reached their eighteenth birthday. To fill the class, at least 6 competitors must complete the course.

49. PLATINUM PERFORMANCE/USEF SHOW JUMPING TALENT SEARCH Open to Junior/Young Riders who are members of the United States Equestrian Federation who have not reached their 21st birthday under USEF rules. Fences 3'6"—3'9".

50. NEHC JUNIOR MEDAL Open to Junior Members of the NEHC who have not reached their eighteenth birthday. All contestants are required to perform over at least eight fences not exceeding 3'3". One or more individual tests of the top four contestants may be requested at the judge's discretion (USEF Tests 1-18). To fill a class, at least four competitors must complete the course. One win required for the finals. All contestants must wear proper attire. Once a contestant has qualified, they are no longer eligible for Medal classes. Violation will forfeit eligibility for the finals for that year.

51. CENTRAL EQUINE JUNIOR MEDAL (M&S) Open to Junior Riders. To be shown over a minimum of 8 fences at 3'6" including a combination and at least two changes of direction after the first fence. Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same horse must be used in all phases. Only one rider per horse. To fill the class, three riders must complete the course.

HUNTER DIVISIONS: Entry Fee is \$25 unless otherwise indicated.

SCHOOLING HUNTER (Open to all horses)

SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER (CHJA, CHSA, NEHC 'C')

Open to riders 12 years of age and under who have never competed over fences exceeding 18" in a recognized show. Riders competing in this division may not compete in any other Recognized Division or Recognized Class in a show where obstacles exceed 18" in height. Course not to exceed eight fences, not to exceed 18".

PRE-CHILDREN'S HUNTER (CHJA, CHSA, NEHC 'C')

Open to junior riders who are eligible for Limit equitation over fences as of December 1 of the current show year. Riders may show horses or ponies. Fence height 2'. At the same show, horse/rider and pony/rider combinations may not cross enter into Children's Hunter Horse/Pony, Pony Hunters or any class where fences exceed 2'6". No combinations permitted.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER (CHJA, CHSA, NEHC 'B')

Open to Junior Exhibitors who are eligible for Intermediate Equitation Over Fences as of December 1 of the current show year. Height of fences 3' for horses, small & medium ponies 2'; large ponies 2'6". The division may be split at the discretion of show management. Same horse/pony rider combination cannot show in any other rated division except Equitation or pleasure. Horses may be shown by another rider in any other division or section at the same show except Jr. Hunter. Ponies may not cross enter into the regular pony hunter division. Riders may not show in any class where the fence heights exceed 3'6" at the same show. Jogging for soundness at the discretion of the judge.

Horses may be shown by a different rider in any other division or class at the same competition. Horses and ponies may be jogged for soundness at judge's discretion. Height of fences 3', spreads not to exceed height of fence. Ponies may be ridden by adults, suitability to count.
